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### <u>Spotlight on: Senior Leadership Team:</u> <u>Mrs Nealon - Headteacher</u>

I am the proud new Headteacher of Eastern Green. I have joined the school after working for most of my career in four different settings in Rugby, where I started life as a Year 4 class teacher but have taught all Primary ages up to Year 6. I have been an Assistant Head, Deputy Head, Head of School and Headteacher before coming to Eastern



Green. I have four children whose ages range from 9 up to 17, 2 cats and in my spare time I love to read, paint with watercolours, go to the gym with my husband (so that we can then eat out - I love my food!) I am very excited to be joining and leading the Eastern Green Family; the children have made me feel so very welcome this week in school. My role in school means that I am responsible for managing the school and making sure that everything is running smoothly on a day-to-day basis. Unlike most teaching staff, often headteachers do not teach lessons in classrooms. Instead, they spend their time using their years of experience to motivate and manage their staff and students, however, teaching is the part that I still love best so this week I have had the pleasure of teaching Year 3 and I will always be on hand to support teachers in the classrooms if I am available to do so!



I will always be available to pupils and parents alike should you want to speak to me, however, in the first instance, please do contact your child's class teacher. We use 'Class Dojo' to communicate with parents - please can I remind you though that class teachers will only respond to Class Dojo messages between the hours of 8am and 6.30pm - if you send a Dojo message your child's teacher will always endeavour to respond in a timely manner, for example if your child has forgotten a book / there has been something you need to make the teacher aware of / you need to share information- some of our teachers have been fielding up to 15 messages a day which I am sure you can appreciate is unmanageable. If your query is of an urgent nature, then please call the school office - class teachers will not check Dojo whilst they are teaching. Teachers are always on hand at the end of the day for a quick chat and we have a catalogue of events planned throughout the school year where you can speak to teachers more in depth about your child and their progress. As you can see, coming up we have our 'Meet the Teacher' event on Friday September 22nd at 3pm and Parents' Evenings are scheduled for Wednesday the 25th and Thursday 26th October. Thank you for your support in ensuring our teachers have a manageable work-life balance.
