How can you support at home? Watch Newsround with your child, talk about what's in the news, open up discussions about the world.








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<u>Attendance</u>

If your child is absent please ensure that you call the school office on 02476 465077 or email: admin@easterngreen.coventry.sch.uk

Please specify the following: Child's full name and class, reason for absence - please do give as much information as possible. If we do not receive confirmation of absence this could result in an unauthorised absence. Please be reminded that morning registration is taken from **8.50 until 9.05 am**. Children who arrive after this time will need to sign in. As the registers close at 9.05 am, anyone who arrives after this time will be unauthorised.

We have continued to see absence in school impacted by holidays taken in term time. Whilst we are empathetic, (as a mum of four, I know that to take a holiday in term time would be much more financially affordable) I do need to stress the importance of school attendance. Did you know...

> 95% attendance means that you have missed two weeks of school.

> 90% attendance means that you have missed four weeks of school/half a day every week.

> 80% attendance means that you have missed eight weeks of school.

AND ...

>Attendance of below 90% over five years is equivalent to you missing half a year of school.

> Attendance below 80% over five years means that will have missed a whole year of school.

As such, research suggests that 17 missed school days a year equals a drop in GCSE grade and only a quarter of pupils will achieve GCSE grades equivalent to the old 'A' to 'C' if their attendance is below 90%.

Please do support your child's learning by ensuring that they are attending school regularly and keep track of their attendance percentage. Many thanks. 😊


