Dear Parents and Carers,

Spring Term One has been a whistle-stop tour, but the children have had a lovely half term, with so much happening, from football matches, rowing competitions, to trips to the river and Number Day. Every day at Eastern Green is jammed full of memorable experiences and learning opportunities and I am so grateful to our incredible teaching team for making it happen for our children!

This week is safer internet week. Today, we talked to the children in assembly about the wonders of the internet; the theme for Safer Internet Day 2024 is 'Inspiring change? Making a difference, managing influence, and navigating change online'. Our discussion focussed on all of the positives that having access to the internet can have and all the positive ways that it can be used, but also, we discussed that, just like in the real world, the internet has both nice and unkind people using it and that there might be people who want to help you and people who may want to trick you or be unkind to you. We reinforced the message that you can't 'see' the people using the internet and it is therefore hard to tell who is trustworthy and who isn't! We shared the message that the most important thing to remember is that if you are upset by something that happens online, to you or to someone else, tell a trusted adult right away. It might be a grown-up you live with or a teacher at school. Please do reinforce this message with your child at home this week. Our children are growing up in a world with such instant access to technology and the internet where there isn't a difference online life and offline life is just life!

Technology can move at an extraordinarily fast pace, so it can be difficult to know how to start talking to your child about what they're doing online, who they might be speaking to or discussing the potential risks and issues. Talking regularly with your child can help keep them safe online. Making it part of daily conversation, like you would about their day at school, will help your child feel relaxed. It also means when they do have any worries, they're more likely to come and speak to you. It's easy to become overwhelmed with the different technology, the language that children use, the huge number of games and apps which are available and the potential risks. **Meet:** Never go to meet someone you have made friends with online. If an online friend wants to see you, talk to an adult you trust. Remember that they might not be who they say they are.

**Accepting:** If someone sends you a photo or a file, ask a trusted adult for help. Do not open the photo or file. It could have a virus.

**Reliable:** Remember that you can't trust everyone who uses the Internet. Not everyone is kind or trustworthy.

Tell: Tell a trusted adult if something online upsets you or makes you worried.



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Vesterday, Year 5 visited Coombe Country Park and completed a river study to support this term's topic work. Luckily, the sun was shining! When we first arrived, we looked at the map and talked about the different parts of the Smite Stream that flowed through the park. We walked down to the duck pond and looked at the revetments that are used to stop the bank from eroding away. Then we split into groups to take part in pond dipping and measuring the river. Whilst we were pond dipping we used a net to scoop out some of the bottom of the pond, which we than emptied into a tray and examined to see what creatures we could find. We found diving beetles, water lice, tadpoles, lesser water boatman, pond skaters, small fish and even a crawfish! Unfortunately, because the rain the day before we could not get into the river to measure as you could not see the bottom so it was not safe. Instead, we used a long pole to measure the depth at 1m intervals across the river. We found it was deepest in the middle. Then we measure the speed of the river by dropping a stick and timing how long it took to go under the bridge. It was a super trip and we learnt lots more about rivers. Year 5 were impeccably behaved! Well done Year 5!

We have started the new year like we ended the last one, with a busy half term of sport here at Eastern Green. Even though it's only been 5 weeks we've packed lots in!

Each year group has completed at least 2 hours of PE lessons a week, on top of their daily mile, playtimes and active movement breaks, all of which encourage 60 active minutes each day. Year 3 have been dancing and sparkling with Ricky each Tuesday and they have enjoyed performing a variety of routines. Year 6 took their turn to have tennis coaching from coach Lucy! It's not quite been the weather for tennis, but the children have still loved every minute of it and Lucy has said how brilliant they are.

The football season has officially begun for our Y5/6 boys' squad. *The boys are currently unbeaten in the league and cup. WOW!* It's great to see the team working so brilliantly together and we can't wait to see what the season has in store for them. The girls in Y5/6 have been patiently waiting for their turn with fixtures due to commence after half term. All of the teams represented our school brilliantly and the teamwork and support for each other was admirable! We are very proud of them all.

#### PE Kit

We have noticed that many children are not wearing suitable kit on their PE days. The purpose of kit is to allow them to participate in physical activities safely. A reminder that PE kit is as follows:

- Black or navy, plain leggings/jogging bottoms/shorts
- Black or navy, plain hoody/jumper for outdoor PE days. No large logos
- House t-shirt or a plain t-shirt in the same colour. No football shirts or non-house colour t-shirts please
- Black, grey or white socks
- Trainers which are designed for sporting activities (not leisure trainers such as Converse)

Please ensure no jewellery is worn on PE days; if it is, it will need to be removed and placed in a valuables box in each classroom. This also applies to watches. Long hair must be tied back on these days too.

From after the half term holiday, if children come to school not wearing the correct kit we will be contacting parents to bring the correct items into school for their child to change into.



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One of our Eastern Green traditions, that children and staff have loved over the years, is our 'Easter Egg Raffle.' This year, we will be holding another raffle for our children at the end of the spring term. It has always been a great success and a lot of fun too!








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
World Book Day takes place on Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> March, and we hope you will join us as we come together to celebrate in school.

This year we are hosting a range of events. The first is that we are asking children (and staff) to **come to school dressed as something from their favourite book**- this could be a character, an item or even dressed as the author!

We encourage you to use things you already have at home for this and do not expect you to buy anything new.

We are also hosting our own 'Big Book Swap'. This is a chance for children to dust off old books and share them with others in their own year group. We would like each child to bring in a book that they no longer read at home. It should be age appropriate and something they think somebody else in their year group may enjoy. To add to the intrigue and excitement of the book swap, we would like the books to be covered in wrapping paper so it is a mystery as to what they will receive. Children should write a note on the front to show their year group and explain what type of book it is or why they would recommend it (e.g. this is an adventure story, for someone who likes funny stories...).

These should be brought into school by **Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> March**. On this day all books from each year group will be set out for children who have taken part to select a new book.



Each child will also receive a £1 book token. This can be taken to your nearest bookseller where you can swap it for a World Book Day story or get £1 off any book or audiobook costing more than £2.99. Each voucher can be used between 15<sup>th</sup> February and 31<sup>st</sup> March.

We hope your child will enjoy participating in our World Book Day celebrations in school.
