

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


World Book Day takes place on Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> March, and we hope you will join us as we come together to celebrate in school.

This year we are hosting a range of events. The first is that we are asking children (and staff) to **come to school dressed as something from their favourite book**- this could be a character, an item or even dressed as the author!

We encourage you to use things you already have at home for this and do not expect you to buy anything new.

We are also hosting our own '**Big Book Swap'**. This is a chance for children to dust off old books and share them with others in their own year group. We would like each child to bring in a book that they no longer read at home. It should be age appropriate and something they think somebody else in their year group may enjoy. To add to the intrigue and excitement of the book swap, we would like the books to be covered in wrapping paper so it is a mystery as to what they will receive. Children should write a note on the front to show their year group and explain what type of book it is or why they would recommend it (e.g. this is an adventure story, for someone who likes funny stories...).



These should be brought into school by **Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> March**. On this day all books from each year group will be set out for children who have taken part to select a new book.

We will also be running our '**Booked Potato'** competition again this year. Over recent years this has proven to great fun, as children are challenged to decorate a potato to look like their favourite book character. Any entries for this should also be brought into the school hall **by Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> March.** 

Each child will also receive a £1 book token. This can be taken to your nearest bookseller where you can swap it for a World Book Day story or get £1 off any book or audiobook costing more than £2.99. Each voucher can be used between 15<sup>th</sup> February and 31<sup>st</sup> March.

We hope your child will enjoy participating in our World Book Day celebrations in school.
